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Abstract

One of the major problems that the today's educational system face all over the world is that of students' misbehavior. The Maritime Academy of Asia and the Pacific is designed to excel regarding the standards and quality of the education it can offer to students. The present study examined about the Behavioral Issues of MAAP Cadets Year 2015 to 2016 in order to identify the specific number of students affected, the most and least common Behavioral Issue and the programs of the Guidance and Counseling Office for the Cadets. The current emphasis on behavioral issues in MAAP attempts to alleviate the increasingly number of Cadets with behavioral issues as reported based on the data acquired.
